The Meeting started with recitation from the Holy Quran by Mr. Akhlaq Ahmad Syed. The Company Secretary intimated the Board of the "Leave of Absence" request received from Muhammad Anwar Shaikh, Mr. Shaheryar Arshad Chishty & Mr. Zafar Abbas Honorable Members of MEPCO Board. The Board, after due consideration, granted the leave of absence to the Honorable Members. The Chairman Board noted the quorum of the meeting and declared the meeting to be in order. The Board Members and key management personnel declared that they do not have any conflict of interest in respect of any Agenda Item being discussed in this meeting.

Following agenda items were presented to the Board. The resultant discussions, approvals and directions of the Board are narrated as under.

AGENDA ITEM NO.1

To consider and confirm the Minutes of 134th BOD Meeting held on 20.03.2018.

The Company Secretary apprised that the Minutes of 134th BOD Meeting held on 20.03.2018, dully endorsed by the Chairman Board were circulated among all the Board Members. The Chairman invited the attention of all Board Members for offering any reservation(s)/comments(s) regarding approval of the minutes.

Decision

135-BOD-R1

There being no objection from the house **RESOLVED** that the Minutes of 134th BOD Meeting held on 20.03.2018 be and is hereby confirmed as true record of the proceedings of this meeting.

AGENDA ITEM NO.2

Presentation regarding ERP implementation.

The Finance Director being the Project Director of ERP gave a detailed presentation to Board regarding implementation status of ERP in MEPCO. He apprised the Board that state of the art Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP) system is being established, initially funded by USAID'S Power Distribution Program through IRG, with the purpose of ensuring the availability of SAP generated timely information required for senior management. The objective of ERP is to make effective decisions and properly monitor and control utility operations and inter-connection of Cost/Revenue centers which are dispersed geographically, which will cut down on the delay in reporting. He intimate the Board about the Project Implementation cost and Project Support and

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running cost. He apprised the Board about the progress achieved on all of three modules i.e. HCM, MM and FICO. After detailed presentations and discussion, the Board showed its satisfaction about the progress and further directed as follows;

Direction

The Board directed the Finance Director to ensure the full utilization of SAP users licenses.

135-BOD-D2 The Board directed the Finance Director to ensure the Go-Live of all of three modules in all circles by 1st July, 2018.

135-BOD-D3 The Board directed the HR & Admin Director to provide the required manpower on short term basis to the Finance Director to clear the backlog.

AGENDA ITEM NO.3

To consider and accord approval for the following matter relating to Procurement Committee.

- i. Deliberation upon the legal opinion obtained from M/S Rajwana & Rajwana Advocates involving following agenda items.
- a. Approval for recycling of damaged HT / LT Copper Winding Scrap into Enamel Copper Wire / Paper Covered Copper Strips against Tender No. 117 dt. 02.01.2018.
- b. Approval for procurement of 151640 Kg. different sizes Paper Covered Copper Strips for MEPCO TRW Multan, B-Pur & Vehari against Tender No 118 dated 04.01.2018.

The Board was apprised that the legal opinion obtained from M/S Rajwana & Rajwana Advocates involving above mentioned agenda items was presented to the Procurement Committee in its meeting held on 11.04.2018. After due diligence, the Committee unanimously agreed to recommend the case to the Board to accord its approval for award of contract wherein the participant firms have quoted same rates with different offered quantities as follows;-

"If only one firm offers the 100% quantity then 100% tendered quantity will be awarded to the one bidder by ignoring the lower offered quantity of other bidders. In case of 2 firms offering 100% quantity with same rate, the quantity will be equally divided between two firms and in case of more than 2 firms offering 100% quantity with same rate, the tender will be scrapped off."

The Chair invited the comments of the members as different members had different perspectives/interpretation upon the legal opinion. He commented that Legal opinion was obtained with the unanimous consensus of the Board. The chair appreciated and encouraged the independent views of the members about the issue. Mr. Khalid Masood Khan endorsed the recommendations of the Board Procurement Committee. He commented that as per his understanding and interpretation of the legal opinion, the tender should be awarded to the firm who has offered 100% quantity and the proportionate share should only be allowed wherein, the 2 firms have quoted 100% quantity by giving them equal share. He was of the opinion that the Company should follow its prevailing practice. Furthermore, the firms who have offered 100% quantity are more responsive as compared to the firms who have quoted 50% quantity as the firm with 100% offered quantity has more weight. The Chief Executive Officer showed his concern that the stock balance of material involved in this legal opinion has already been exhausted and the transformer reclamation workshops are in dire need of the material. In case of retendering the tender, a high rate of the material is expected to be quoted by the firms due to escalation of LME and US Dollar Exchange Rate. Besides this, considerable time will be required to complete the process of rebidding, which will worsen the scenario being faced by the transformer reclamation workshops due to shortage of material. So, he requested the Board to decide the case as per recommendations of the Procurement Committee. Mr. Saad Ullah Khan disagreed with this verdict with the plea that the Legal opinion was obtained with the unanimous consensus of the Board, meaning thereby that the Board had that not such expertise to decide the case and the Company may have legal consequences in case the 50% offering quantity firms opt for any legal remedy. He gave his remarks that as per his understanding and interpretation of the legal opinion, the tender should be awarded to firms by allowing proportionate share to each competing firm having offered same rates, so, the firms offering 50% quantity should never be ignored as the firm quoting 50% quantity has also fulfilled the requisite criteria mentioned in bidding documents. As



far as the past practice of awarding tender to the firm offering 100% quantity is concerned, this cannot be made basis to decide the recent tenders in question. Considering the different views and interpretation of the legal opinion, the Chair decided to have a voting to resolve the issue. Considering the present stock position of the material, expected increased quoted rates in case of rebidding, Mr. Asrar Ahmed Malik, Mr. Bilal Ahmed Butt and Muhammad Akram Ch. seconded the verdict of Mr. Khalid Masood Khan, whereas; Mr. Saad Ullah Khan recorded his dissent note as narrated above. With majority of 4-1, the Chair resolved to endorse the recommendations of the Procurement Committee.

With majority of 4-1, **RESOLVED** that the recommendations of the Board Procurement Committee are hereby endorsed for award of contract wherein the participant firms have quoted same rates with different offered quantities as follows;-

"If only one firm offers the 100% quantity then 100% tendered quantity will be awarded to the same bidder and ignore the bidders who offered 50% quantity. In case where two firms offer 100% quantity and same rate, the quantity will be equally divided between two firms and in case of more than 2 firms offering 100% quantity with same rate, the tender will be scrapped off."

The efficiency of all field offices is not mutually synchronized in accordance to the priority list of Circle office regarding installation of new connections. MEPCO is providing transformer upto capacity of 200-KVA transformer through departmental purchase which is very slow while transformer of 400-KVA and 630-KVA are allowed for self-purchase, resulting earlier availability of material. Hence the consumer of self-purchase stress to energize the connection

being formality completed, prior to their turn as per mixed priority list. SE (Op) MEPCO Circle Muzaffargarh has requested vide his letter No.18417-20 dated 15.02.2018 to prepare/maintain separate priority list of new connection where transformer is self purchased 400-KVA & 630-KVA) for all categories of tariff. The Committee was requested to recommend the case for Board's approval. The Board was informed that Procurement Committee of the Board has recommended this case for Board's consideration and approval. The Board was requested to accord its approval for allowing preparing & maintaining separate priority lists of all type of new connections where transformer is self-purchased & installation of connection accordingly.

Decision

xii. Approval for payment against Agreement signed between MEPCO & PITC regarding services to be provided for establishment & operation of Customer Complaint Management System.

The Agenda was presented by the Chief Engineer /CS Director. The Board was apprised that the case was presented to the Procurement Committee in its meeting held on 11.04.2018. The Committee was informed that as per instructions of Ministry as well as M.D PEPCO, PITC is establishing a centralized Customer Complaint Management System (CCMS) for all DISCOs. The Service Level Agreement (SLA) for above services signed by all DISCOs (including MEPCO) with PITC. A copy of agreement duly signed by CEOs, PITC, Lahore and MEPCO is placed below. As per agreement clause 11.1 "Advance Payment" an amount of Rs.10 Million (out of Capex) is to be paid in advance and Opex will be Rs.1.19 per consumer per month under clause 11.2 a (iii) up to 0.5 million SMS / month. Complaint handling above 0.5 Million SMS per month & bulk SMS will be charged @ Rs.0.15 + Tax per SMS (clause 3.5.4. & 3.5.5 of agreement refers)." The Committee was requested to recommend the case for Board's approval. The Board was apprised that Procurement Committee of the Board had desired a presentation to the Board from the representative of PITC for establishment & operation of proposed Customer Complaint Management System before proceeding in this matter. The representative of PITC gave a detailed presentation about working implementation status of the system. After due deliberation the Board resolved/directed as follows.

135-BOD-R14 RESOLVED that the recommendations of the Board Procurement Committee for approval for payment of Rs.10 Million Capex in advance and Opex Rs.1.19 per consumer per month (upto 0.5 million SMS / month) and Rs.0.15 + Tax per SMS for

complaint handling above 0.5 Million SMS per month and bulk SMS to PITC for establishment and operation of centralized CCMS is hereby accorded.

The authenticity of the working of the system should be ensured by generating complaints from reference number of all of the 174 subdivisions on trail basis for every day of week and a report should be prepared and submitted to the Board for its consideration.

135-BOD-D13 The Board directed the Finance Director to suggest a mechanism/solution for recovery of the Capex being paid to PITC in advance.

xiii. Approval of tentative procurement plan for F.Y. 2018-19 for procurement of Grid Station & Transmission Line Material required by GSC and GSO formations under MEPCO's own Resources.

The agenda was presented by Chief Engineer (Dev) PMU. The Board was intimated that the case was presented to the Procurement Committee in its meeting held on 11.04.2018. The Committee was apprised that GSC & GSO formations have forwarded the requirement of material for F.Y. 2018-19 for completion of various ongoing, new projects and maintenance in MEPCO's jurisdiction under MEPCO's own resources. The present stock of own resources material as well as under procurement is not sufficient to cater the demand of GSC for ongoing works as well as new projects and GSOs demand for the maintenance of the Grid System Operation. This required material is needed to be procured / purchased by floating NCB tenders. The detail of material required to be purchased /procured for completion of these works. The cost of required procurement is estimated to be Rs. 2,540 Million (Approx.) having detail as under:-

i. Estimated cost of Grid Station Material to be procured = Rs. 1,616 M

ii.Estimated Cost of T/Line material to be procured = Rs. 924 M

Total Estimated Cost = Rs. 2,540 M
